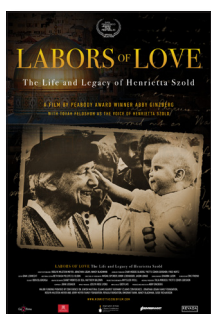

A visionary leader and one of history's most influential, yet under-recognized, American Jewish women, Henrietta Szold left an indelible mark on the 20th century. She founded Hadassah in 1912,

creating a vital link between American women and communities in pre-state Israel. Through this organization, she established the region's modern healthcare system, built on a mandate to treat Arabs and Jews equally. Later, she spearheaded Youth Aliyah, an operation that rescued 11,000 Jewish children from Nazi Europe.

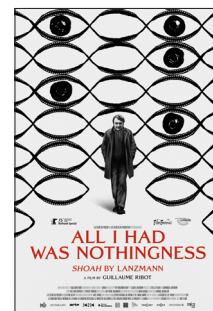

Claude Lanzmann spent 12 years creating *SHOAH*, a groundbreaking film that redefined Holocaust representation. Forty years later, filmmaker Guillaume Ribot explores 220 hours of unreleased footage, as Lanzmann's quest to capture the reality of the Holocaust led him to interview victims, witnesses, and perpetrators from all over the world. Ribot pays homage to one of cinema's masterpieces and to its director's relentless pursuit of telling the untold. More than a "making-of" documentary, *All I Had Was Nothingness* stands as a moving meditation on memory, testimony, and the power of cinema to confront history.

But when his estranged Argentine father and sister suddenly arrive for a three-week visit after a decade apart, the drama—and the comedy—hits the roof. *Hola! Chau* is a

charming look at forgiveness, family chaos, and bridging generations, offering spirited humor, tender moments, and a refreshing reminder of what family is all about.

Maintenance Artist is the first feature documentary about pioneering public artist Mierle Laderman Ukeles, the New York City Sanitation Department's official artist-in-residence. After becoming a

mother, Ukeles declared that her household and childcare work would be performance art—a radical act that brought her into the male-dominated 1960s avant-garde. Guided by her Jewish faith, which finds sanctity in the profane, she expanded her practice to include museum workers and, later, sanitation workers. Set amid the social and artistic revolutions of the late 20th century, *Maintenance Artist* tells the story of an artist who redefined the meaning of art and labor.

On the morning of October 7, 2023, Israeli-American Liat Atzili and her husband Aviv were at home when Hamas attacked their kibbutz. By nightfall, Liat and Aviv are captives in Gaza along with 250 other

people—12 of whom, like Liat, are American citizens. Caught between international diplomacy and a rapidly escalating war, their family must face their own uncertainty and conflicting political perspectives in the pursuit of Liat and Aviv's release. This agonizing process, and the ultimate fate of their loved ones, challenges how the members of the family understand themselves and their place in the conflict. Through the intimate lens of a family's experience, *Holding Liat* poses complex questions of identity across generations, as the family is thrust into the epicenter of a global conflict rapidly unfolding in real-time. 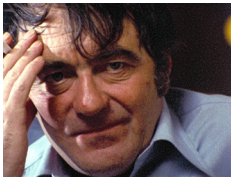
